- To understand the value of toilets and the potential effects of a lack of adequate sanitation.
- To evaluate sanitation systems that are adapted to suit different social, economic, and geographic contexts.
- To practice drawing connections between local challenges and global contexts and best practices.

TERMINOLOGY

- **Sanitation** – conditions relating to public health, especially the provision of clean drinking water and adequate sewage disposal.
- **Latrine toilet** – a very simple toilet facility, usually just a pit or trench in the ground.
- **Open defecation** – the practice of defecating outside ("in the open") rather than into a toilet. People may choose fields, bushes, forests, ditches, streets, canals or other open space.
- **Cesspool** – underground storage for liquid waste, either a holding tank (sealed at the bottom) or a soak pit (not sealed at the bottom).
- **Septic Tank** – a basic onsite waste treatment system. Anaerobic (oxygen-free) bacterial processes provide a moderate treatment efficiency, but groundwater pollution can still be a problem.
- **Advanced Treatment Unit (ATU)** - a small biological treatment system more effective than a traditional septic system. ATUs add air (oxygen) to help break down organic matter.

IDEAS FOR ACTION

Easier

- Identify the components of your own sanitation system at home. Where does the water that you flush and wash your hands with come from? Where does waste go and how is it treated?

Medium

- Research alternative toilets like the Tiger Toilet. How do they compare? How are their field trials and pilot programs progressing? Write an article about which system you recommend and why.
- Inventing a new toilet is great, but how will it be implemented and accepted in the host community? Research the importance of local engagement in development programs and different strategies NGOs use to ensure changes are fully integrated and sustainable in the community.
- Spread awareness of the importance of sanitation management. Organize a webinar with a panel of speakers-- government personnel, sanitation engineers, toilet designers, etc. to discuss their work and how they got started in the field.

Hard

- Policy advocacy: research bills in the city council and state legislature related to cesspools, public restrooms, or sanitation. Write and submit testimony.
