

# TEACHER WORKSHOP: *Sounds of the Asia Pacific*



This interactive teacher workshop is open to all K-12 teachers of Hawai'i and is presented in conjunction with East-West Center Gallery exhibition "Musical Instruments: Sounds of the Asia Pacific."

This teacher workshop includes presentations about Ethnomusicology, the science of sound, and the musics of India, Japan, and Micronesia. In addition, we will offer curricular connections and an instrument-making workshop using repurposed materials.



This teacher workshop focuses on musical traditions of the Asia Pacific region and is offered in conjunction with the EWC Gallery exhibition featuring Asia Pacific musical instruments from the Ethnomusicology Instrument Collection at the University of Hawai'i at Mānoa, Music Department. The collection has been acquired over the past 70 years and is an invaluable resource for the community because the instruments are meant to be utilized rather than to be displayed as museum pieces. Many of the instruments in the collection are used in the various musical ensembles at the university. This exhibition also features costumes, masks, photographs, and video to assist in understanding the fuller cultural context of the instruments.

This teacher workshop offers presentations by local practitioners who are professional artists in the musical traditions presented as part of the exhibition.

Participants will learn about various forms of traditional music from Asia and the Pacific, experience hands-on workshops, discover strategies to incorporate this topic in the classroom, and gain access to resources in the community.
